## Handy Hints:



Use the pictures/pages as discussion starters

Not all family members have to be birth related - a child might view a very close friend as a part of the family

Use it as a way to understand how a child views their family - who is who, what happens in their family, strengths and weaknesses, would they change anything? The day to day dynamics

You could do this with the family as a whole or individually.

You can't go far wrong with this as all families are different but do be very mindful that family history and functioning can sometimes be traumatic and difficult for children to express, don't push a child to have discussions if they don't feel comfortable - focus on building the relationship first.
